On November 6, 2023, the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice Science, in collaboration with the Department of Commerce C Section (Shift 2), organized an awareness program. The speaker, Ms. Deepika, Sub-Inspector of Avadi Commissionerate, aimed to educate college students about social issues and women's concerns, including rape, suicide, human trafficking, love affairs, POCSO, and sexual harassment. The ultimate goal was to raise awareness and generate knowledge about these societal issues.

Objective of learning :

TAMIL NADU STATE POLICE MUSEUM

On February 21, 2024, the students of BA Criminology and Criminal Justice Science, along with two staff members Ms. Sneha and Mr. Dhanalingam, visited the Tamil Nadu State Police Museum. The purpose of the visit was to understand the organizational structure and functioning of the police commission. This visit provided the students and me with a wealth of knowledge. The students were particularly fascinated by the old equipment used during the British period for wars and other purposes, including protective gear, police uniforms, and administrative items.

The museum highlights the evolution of the police force from the colonial era to the present day, highlighting technological advancements. The grand portico, supported by Doric columns, houses a blue Plymouth Belvedere once used by the Commissioner of Police. Exhibits include landmark cases handled by the Chennai police, mannequins displaying various police uniforms, and a bandsman with different musical instruments. Rare sculptures recovered by the Idol Wing are also on display.

Visitors can see a range of firearms from 303 rifles to the latest Bren light machine guns, as well as 12 bore bullets. The verandah features a Penny Farthing Bicycle used by constables, a Royal Enfield bike used by dispatchers, and a motorized speedboat used by coastal security personnel. Brass bells used by firefighters to signal different alarms were also exhibited. The museum highlights several important cases handled by the Chennai police, and a timeline from the Sangam era to the present is displayed. Additionally, the collection includes swords, cameras, riot gear, explosives, and handcuffs used by police personnel. A replica of the Commissioner's office has been recreated for visitors.

Outcome of the visit:

Our students gained insights into the roles, duties, and functions of policing from historical to medieval times.



PORT VISIT

The students of B.Sc Criminology participated in an educational port visit as part of their curriculum. The visit aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding of port operations, security measures, and the role of law enforcement in maritime settings.

Upon arrival, the students were greeted by the port authority's security team, who gave an overview of the port's layout and the critical infrastructure involved in daily operations. The visit concluded with a Q&A session, where students engaged with the port officials and crew members, asking questions about real-world applications of their criminology studies in maritime environments. The experience provided invaluable practical knowledge and a deeper appreciation of the complexities involved in port security and maritime law enforcement.

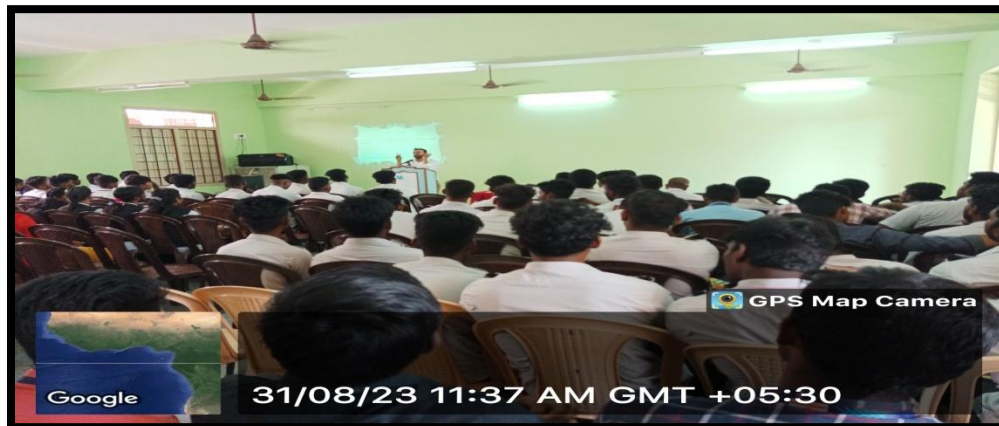


DATA ANALYSIS USING SPSS IN CRIMINOLOGY

It was formed by the virtue of **Juvenile Justice Act**. The JJB consist of 3 members. Judicial Magistrate of the first class and two social workers, at least one of whom should be A Women. On Observation Home is an institution, where neglected and delinquent juveniles are kept for a few weeks or pending decision of the cases. Children are brought by the police.

The in charge of Juvenile Observation Home was Superintendent, he taught the role and responsibilities of the officers, doctor, psychologist, Judge, advocate, and cook of Observation home

He took a brief class about Juvenile and its related law in India. He explained about the consists of observation home are reception near to the gate, they are individual room for boys and girls (children conflict with law) Two office room for documentary and police officer, TV Hall, Dining Hall, playing room, kitchen room and observation home was covered under the surveillance of the security camera.

Juveniles are the person who has not attained the age of majority that means who is below 18 and has committed a crime. Juvenile crime committed person are called as **Children Conflict with law**. They are 8 Juvenile Observation Home in Tamil Nadu.

In Observation home, the juvenile will give formal education inside the cell and also, they will be given training in following works are

- Tailoring.
- Bakery work.
- Hand grafting work. Etc
